Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

I am writing to update you on school's position in relation to opening after the half term break. After the initial Governments announcement at the beginning of January we reduced pupil and staff numbers on site to ensure our community remained safe taking into consideration the lack of social distancing, high staff ratios and the size of the school and it's staff in total.

We have been working with the Local Authority to support us to open for more pupils with a view of Special School staff being in a priority group for the vaccine. A vaccine rollout programme has been confirmed for staff this week and will commence prior to the half term break. The vaccine will offer a further layer of protection for our school community, although we still need to adhere to the safety measures we had in place prior to Christmas.

With this is mind after half term we invite all pupils back into school where parents feel this is right for their child. We must not underestimate the continued pandemic, and the risks the school environment can bring however, we do appreciate that home learning is not always beneficial for all of our pupils, we recognise a lack of structure and routine can be difficult for all of our families. Pupils will remain in their original bubbles, there will be no off-site activities, physical Education or Forest Schools during the lockdown however, we will be offering swimming to pupils every other week. I do appreciate this will be difficult decision for many parents, and unfortunately it is a decision that you need to make as a family. We have in place a number of safety measures to support the prevention of the spread of COVID, but these measures will not eradicate it from school completely, all our safety measures are outlined with the risk assessment on the website. We will support all parents who wish their children to come in school (this will be on a full-time basis only) but equally we will support those parents who wish for their children to remain at home. There will be no fines issued for children whose parents wish them to remain at home.

We will be offering a programme of remote learning; however, this may not look exactly like it has during this first half term as all teachers will be back in school on a full-time basis.

EfL Update



On the website, they detail all activities and services available to young people with SEND. They might not all currently be running because of COVID-19 but we just wanted to share this with you so you can look at options that might be suitable for your son/daughter outside of school in the coming months. You can filter the results by age, location or interests so you may well find something perfect for your son/daughter.

We need your help so that people with a learning disability get priority for the coronavirus vaccine



Despite the fact that people with a learning disability are more than six times as likely to die from coronavirus as the general population, many people with a learning disability are not in any of the priority groups that will get a potentially life-saving vaccine soon.

This is unfair and puts lives at risk. We need your help to change this.

We are at an important time with the fight against the pandemic, but there is hope as the new vaccine is rolled out. Having a coronavirus vaccine is the best way to protect you, and the people around you, from coronavirus.

Some people are getting priority for having the vaccine. For example, priority group 6 includes people with a severe or profound learning disability – but not everyone with a learning disability is included.

Health in Wales is devolved to the Welsh Government. If you live in Wales, you can take action by signing a petition to the Senedd Cymru, calling for all people with learning disabilities in Wales to be made a higher priority. <u>Sign the petition to the Senedd Cymru today</u>.

If you live in England, please can you email your MP and ask for all people with a learning disability to be included in at least group 6?

Share your story with your MP

If you have a learning disability, or care for someone who does, your MP needs to hear from you.

Share your experience and ask your MP to write to Matt Hancock, Secretary of State for Health and Social Care, and call for all people with a learning disability to be a priority for the vaccine
