White Ribbon Day 2018

White Ribbon Day aims to raise awareness of domestic violence. Cheshire East held an event which included stories from survivors of Domestic Abuse and their experiences in the workplace. It was really inspiring.

During the event students from The Oaks Academy performed a brilliant drama piece on everyday sexism.

Last year they worked with the National Theatre where a play was written for them based around attitudes towards gender, online safety, relationship abuse and more! They performed this at the Lowry.

Safer parking initiative at Wistaston Church Lane Academy

Wistaston Church Lane Academy invited the Cheshire East Parking Enforcement team to deliver a safer parking initiative. They worked with Cheshire Fire and Rescue and the police, highlighting the 'do's and don'ts' of parking safely and legally around the school. Parents and children were involved. Children were taught about the basics of parking signs and restrictions in and around the area to keep pedestrians safe.

There was great engagement and interest from the school children and parents on the day, and it was another fantastic opportunity to raise awareness of road safety in the borough.
