

Ranger Events - May 2025

Our sites have been busy, in recent weeks, as the weather has been warmer and families have been enjoying the Easter break. At the same time we've been seeing lots more wildlife activity from both flora and fauna. <u>Take a look at our 'Out and About' section, from Ranger Pete, below.</u>

In this month's newsletter we have some information about an important initiative to reduce the numbers of livestock attacks in the countryside, plus some last chance event booking opportunities and all the events coming up in May.

Operation RECALL

Operation RECALL - awareness week has been running recently. Every year, thousands of farm animals and wildlife are killed or injured by dog attacks. Figures suggest at least **one dog a week is shot** because of livestock attacks. As recently as last week a dog attack led to the **death of a sheep, pregnant with 2 lambs** in Pott Shrigley.

The **Operation RECALL** project aim to drastically reduce the number of incidents where animals suffer, whether that's injured livestock or dogs killed as a

What's Out and About

In between the April showers, keep an eye out on what's out and about in the remaining weeks of the month:


- Warm evenings encourage bats such as the pipistrelle to emerge from hibernation.
- Warblers are in full song from mid month. Listen for willow warblers and blackcaps who have arrived from their wintering grounds in Africa.
- Look out for smooth newts; they are now active in the ponds at <u>Jacksons</u> Brickworks Local Nature Reserve.
- As the insects are more abundant, swallows and house martins can be seen busy feeding and looking for nesting sites.
- Butterflies such as the speckled wood can be seen on the wing. Look for them in dappled woodland and along country lanes.
- Look out for the spectacular display flight of the lapwing in open countryside. This bird is also known as the Peewit or green plover.
- Bluebells burst into flower and can be seen carpeting the woodland floor.

Thursday, 22 May - Plein Air Painting Workshop: Sky, Clouds and Aerial Perspective Workshop

Join us for fun Plein Air painting workshops in 2025 at Tegg's Nose Country Park. In each workshop, experienced professional painters, Christopher Clements and Kieran Ingram, will help you capture a different aspect of landscape painting.



Workshop Price £85, reserve your place with a £25 deposit on Eventbrite, the remainder will be invoiced before the course.

In May's workshop we'll focus on painting the sky and distance. The sky is key to landscape painting, it provides a dramatic backdrop for the whole picture and is often one of the first considerations.

You'll look at types of clouds and their structure, what they're doing and how they recede into the distance. Combine this with colour shifts as things get further away, and you'll create great atmosphere and depth in your work.

We'll cover:

- types and behaviour of clouds
- warm and cool colour
- aerial perspective and atmosphere

All the Plein Air workshops we're running this summer are based on the Tonalist approach which focuses on interpretation of the light & dark tones of the landscape, while simplifying the colours. The approach will help you to make sense of what you see. You'll be able to organise it into a well-structured painting, evoking the simple beauty of your environment.

Whether you're a beginner or a seasoned painter, these workshops are perfect for anyone looking to improve their Plein Air painting skills. It's a fantastic opportunity to get out of the studio and unleash your creativity in the great outdoors.
