Engaging with Children and Young People

Our <u>SEND Youth Forums</u> have been attending different meetings to discuss their views, updating videos, designing and reviewing paperwork and learning new life skills.

Supported Internships

A <u>supported internship</u> is designed to be the final year of education. It is aimed to support young people with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) between the ages of 16-24 years old.

Axis Academy School

A planning application has now been submitted for the new Social Emotional and Mental Health free school in Crewe which will be known as 'The Axis Academy School'.

TOGETHER

<u>'TOGETHER'</u> is our shared definition of coproduction in Cheshire East. Our coproduction guide sets out how we will work together as equal partners to improve, develop and deliver services towards a common goal for all of our children, young people, families and adults.

Quality Assurance of Education, Health and Care Plans

Since the Ofsted visit last year, the SEND team have attended training run by the Council for Disabled Children to improve the quality of Education, Health and Care Plans.

SEND High Needs Funding Consultation Events

We are looking to improve the system for allocating high needs top-up funding to children and young people with an Education, Health and Care Plan in Cheshire East.

SEND Future Options Event

Young people with additional needs, in year 9 (aged 13-14) upwards, and their families are invited to a drop in event where they can find out more about what is available when they leave education.

SEND Structure Update

I would like to thank everyone who has responded to the consultation on the SEND Structure Having taken account of the responses we are now moving to implement a locality structure.

Timeliness and Quality of EHC Plans

We are able to report that we are seeing significant progress in terms of improving timeliness of completing EHCP within 20 weeks. We have also been making progress in terms of quality but we will now be stepping up our work in this area.
