We have had an outbreak of Covid in school and cases have been on the increase. We are taking precautionary measures as advised by Public Health England. If you child does show Covid symptoms as outlined below, please ensure they stay at home until the symptoms have gone.

Symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) in adults can include:

- a high temperature or shivering (chills) a high temperature means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste
- shortness of breath
- · feeling tired or exhausted
- an aching body
- a headache
- a sore throat
- a blocked or runny nose

- loss of appetite
- diarrhoea
- feeling sick or being sick

As an early indicator, we are not expecting huge disruption following the planned teachers strike action. We will keep you updated as plans unfold nearer the time.
