Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had a wonderful end to the half term today celebrating all the successes with our Pupil of the Term certificates and medals.

Although we have had a difficult term with regards to COVID, our children always amaze us in bouncing back to make great progress. I am sure you will join me in thanking our wonderful staff teams for being so flexible and working to support each other whilst staff have been recovering form COVID and other illnesses. Also, a huge thank you to you all in being so vigilant with your children and supporting the Government guidelines to keep everyone safe.

The Government have announced further changes yesterday which apply from today and will be in place on our return from the Easter break.

Changes to COVID guidelines from Friday 1st April:

- children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at
 home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare
 when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.
- adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days.
- regular asymptomatic testing is no longer recommended in any education or childcare setting, including in SEND, alternative provision and children's social care settings.

Wishing you all a fantastic Easter we hope the weather is kind and we will see you on our return on **Tuesday 19th April.**
