Our Immersive Learning Space is a fantastic room which enables our students to experience a range of sensory and true to life experiences, immersing them through image and sound. The room offers the opportunity to develop cause and effect skills through a range of interactive features such as touching the walls or the floor surface to pop bubbles, make fish swim away or even to create music.
